

This edition of the IJVM has some interesting and relevant articles: Dr. Shaul Pozzi and his co-workers present concrete evidence of the first outbreak of Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome in Israel. Although the disease is prevalent in Europe and the United States, this publication represents a special local opportunity for the journal to be the first to report this disease in Israel.

At present Israel is going through a rabies outbreak in the north of Israel. The number of cases of rabies has risen dramatically: Since the beginning of 2017 there have been more than 50 cases of rabies in Israel. In 2016, 29 incidents were reported and in 2015, 27 cases. The IJVM presents in this edition an interesting review entitled "Rabies Prophylactic Approaches" by Dr. R. Ramya and colleagues from the Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University in India. The article offers a review of the different prophylactic approaches which is certainly of interest during these times.

Sadly Prof. Nissim Silanikove, an expert on milk products and lacation, passed away recently. In this current journal we publish an article written by him and his co-workers shortly before his passing. An obituary and information about Prof. Nissim Silanikove is presented at the end of the interesting article.
